SPECIFICATIONS

New Zealand's long growing season and cool maritime climate make ideal conditions for grape growing, producing some distinctive, premium-quality wines. As a result of grapes being grown in such a range of mini-climates and soil types, a diverse range of styles has developed.

Sauvignon Blanc is New Zealand's most commonly planted grape, producing the world's best Sauvignon Blanc. Its unique style is more pungently fruity than any other wine from the grape variety.

Grapes were harvested in the cool of the night and the juice was slowly fermented under controlled temperature conditions in stainless steel tank to preserve the fresh fruit flavours. The wine was promptly removed from the fermentation lees and bottled.

Wine: 2019 Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc

Region: Grapes Harvested from Marlborough's Awatere and Wairau Valleys.

Harvest Date: 20th March through to 4th April 2019.
